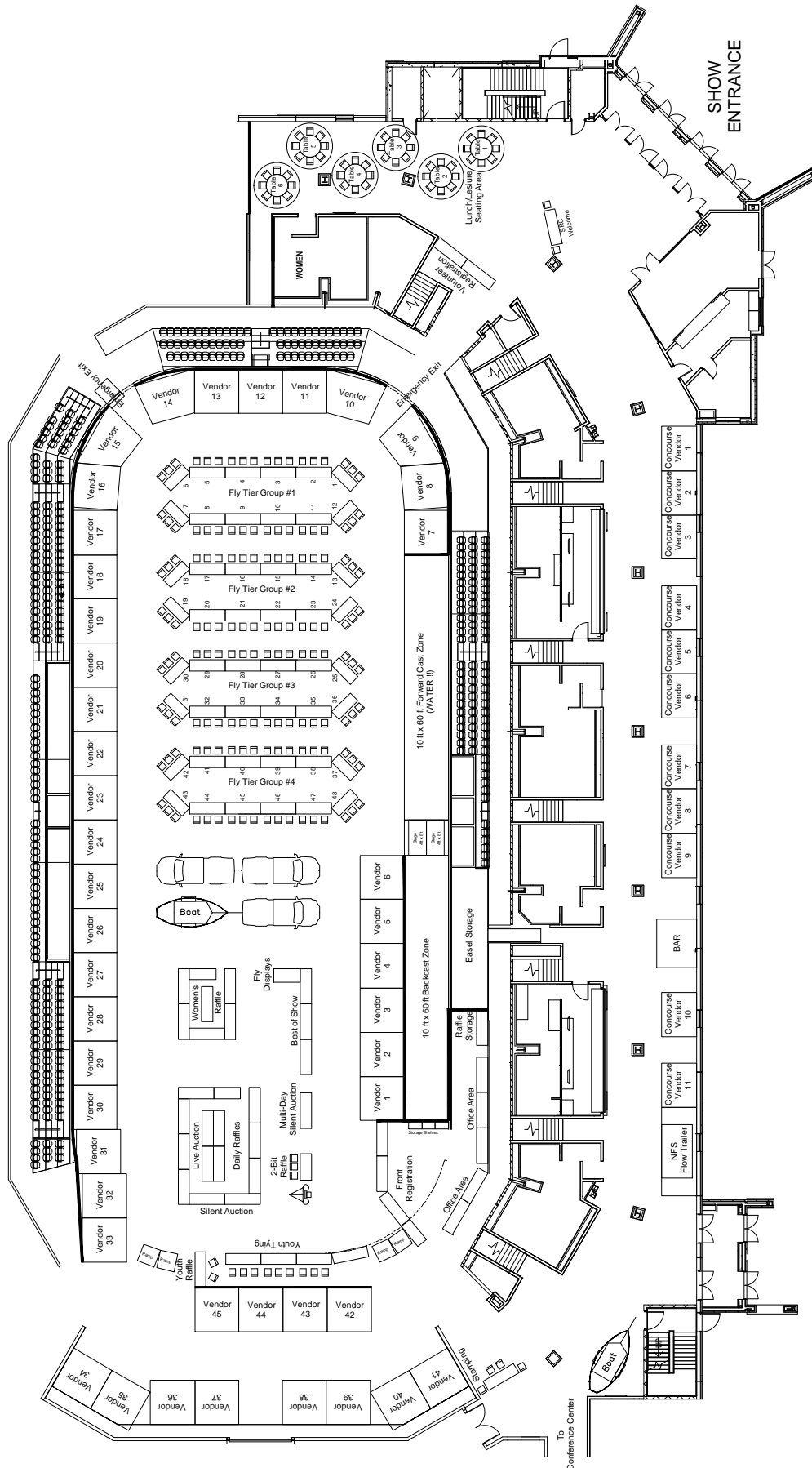

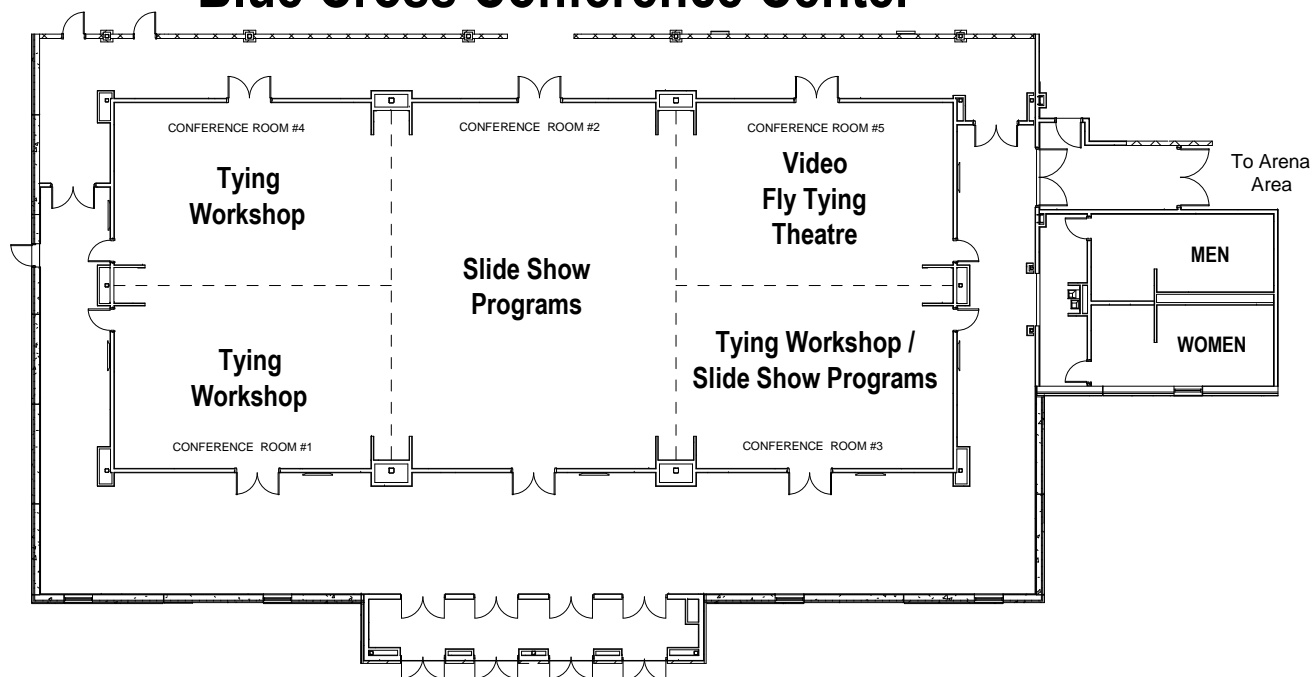

Friday 9:00 am to 12:00 pm – Introduction to Fly Tying \$45

This workshop is designed for women only as a beginning fly tying workshop or as a refresher course for novice fly tiers. The workshop is taught by some of the top female tiers in the Rocky Mountain area who will cover the basic tools and materials needed to get started. You will tie patterns that are useful for learning basic techniques and CATCHING FISH. Come join this unique fly tying experience with other women and learn from some of the best. Tools will be available for use, however if you have tools please bring them.

We believe that our inexpensive and hands-on instruction at these workshops makes our Expo unique among all of the shows throughout the Northern Rockies. These workshops are generally for a maximum of 10 people and are very educational and highly intensive. Most years the workshops fill up prior to the Expo, but be sure to check at registration desk to see if there are any openings available. We are proud to offer our workshops at a very affordable rate, making instruction from some top notch fly fishers possible for everyone.

- For the tying workshops students need to bring, at a minimum, their tying tools, thread and lamp. Instructors will supply all the necessary materials except thread. Some threads may be specifically requested by the instructor, so please check the description.
- For the beginning fly casting workshops, if you have a rod and reel please bring them, otherwise for those without equipment we will supply the rods and reels. The casting workshops will be outdoors so dress accordingly to include warm clothing and rain jacket. For the spey casting workshop please bring warm clothing, rain jacket, waders and boots. If you have a spey rod and reel please bring them, otherwise for those without equipment, spey rods and reels will be available.
- *The Women's Fly Fishing Clinic* will be held in Conference Room #1. You will be outside casting for part of the day, so dress accordingly with warm clothes and a rain jacket. Rods and reels will be available for those without equipment. *Lunch will be included.*

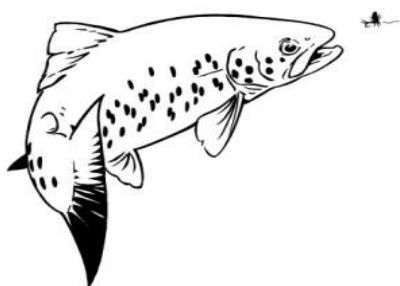

Raffles & Silent Auction

Raffles and silent auctions are held each day of the Expo to raise money to support our conservation and education efforts. There are three raffles and three silent auctions each day on Friday and Saturday. In addition, there are three raffles held at the Ladies Table, two boats raffled in “two-bit” raffles, and opportunities to purchase chances for rods and reels on our “Bingo Board.” Please give generously to these raffles so valuable work on our local fisheries and especially our home river the South Fork can take place. You will find many opportunities to win great prizes and support our conservation and education efforts. Tickets are: \$1 each; \$5 gets you 7; and \$10 gets you 15, \$20 gets you 35, and \$50 gets you 100. If you purchased any advance sale packages (Brookie, Cutthroat, Grayling, Bull Trout, Sturgeon) any tickets included in these packages can be used on these raffles.

The Pale Morning Dun Raffle – Friday’s morning raffle starts at 10:00 am and ends at 12:00 pm; the silent auction starts at 10:00 am and ends at 12:30 pm. The “PMD” hatch is our favorite morning hatch and a fun time to present your favorite imitation to sipping wary trout. This raffle honors cherished memories of overcast mornings on the Henry’s Fork with these delicate mayflies appearing as if by magic on the water.

The Stonefly Raffle – Friday’s mid-day raffle starts at 12:30 pm and ends at 3:00 pm; the silent auction starts at 1:00 pm and ends at 3:30 pm. Nothing boils a fly fisherman’s blood like the cry, “The stones are hatching.” These big pieces of protein drive the trout into a feeding frenzy as they throw caution to the wind, slashing at fluttering stonefly adults skittering across the water. Honor the big bugs and purchase a few tickets in this raffle.

Whitefish Raffle – Friday’s afternoon raffle starts at 3:30 pm and ends at 5:30 pm; the silent auction starts at 4:00 pm and ends at 6:00 pm. Whitefish are native to Idaho waters, and like Rodney Dangerfield, they just “Don’t Get No Respect.” Affectionately known locally as the “Stiffie,” Whitefish are generally a mid-river fish and are actually more susceptible to degraded water conditions than trout. Studies are now revealing that at the time of settlement of Idaho, the Big Lost River contained only Whitefish, and trout were later introduced by settlers. Accounts indicate a favorite early fly was dubbed “Giant Powder,” as dynamite was then called. Buy tickets in this raffle to honor the longevity of these Idaho natives and the clean water where they make their home.

Rainbow Trout Raffle – This Saturday raffle is our salute to the venerable Rainbow trout and our fisheries of Silver Creek, the Henry’s Fork, and the Madison. This raffle starts at 8:30 am and ends at 10:30 am; the silent auction starts at 8:30 am and ends at 11:00 am. The number one issue facing Rainbow trout today is whirling disease. Fly Fishers International at the International Fly Fishing Center are working hard with many experts and biologists to understand the impact of this disease on our fisheries. Purchase tickets in this raffle to help support this important research and the lively fish that are so much fun to catch.

The Grayling Raffle - This Saturday raffle starts at 11:00 am and ends at 1:00 pm; the silent auction starts at 11:30 am and ends at 1:30 pm. The Grayling is considered one of the premier fish for the angler with a fly rod. These fish now occupy only a fraction of their original range in Idaho, Montana and Wyoming. The upper sections of the Big Hole River in Montana and a few lakes in Yellowstone National Park are all that is left today of self-sustaining Grayling populations. The Big Hole Foundation and concerned members of Fly Fishers International are working hard to preserve Grayling populations in the West. Yellowstone National Park waters arguably have the best chance of seeing a Grayling recovery. Cast a few dollars to help this research by purchasing tickets in this raffle.

The Cutthroat Raffle - This Saturday raffle starts at 1:30 pm and ends at 3:00 pm; the silent auction starts at 2:00 pm and ends at 3:30 pm. The Cutthroat is the hallmark Salmonid of the Intermountain West and is synonymous with the South Fork of the Snake River. Cutthroat trout have been reduced to only a fraction of their original range. Money raised during the Expo has been used very effectively over the past twenty two years to rehabilitate Cutthroat habitat on the South Fork to support recovery of our namesake trout. Spend a few more dollars this year to continue this legacy.

Ladies Raffle - Here's another popular Expo tradition. The Ladies Raffle Table features many non-fishing items from household and personal specialties to the beautiful and sought-after Expo quilt. Keeping with the flavor of the Expo, a balanced fly-fishing outfit will also be offered. The table offers two daily drawings each day with drawing time Friday at 1:30 pm and 5:00 pm and again on Saturday at 12:00 pm and 4:00 pm. A separate ladies raffle will also be run during the banquet Saturday evening. Don't miss the fun at this unique raffle table, you are sure to find something for everybody!

"Two Bit" Boat Raffles – Each day of the Expo, we offer "Two Bit" raffles for boats. One winner will be drawn at the conclusion of the Expo each day on Friday and Saturday. 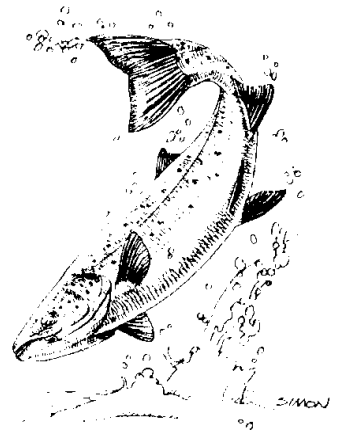

Expo Dollars at Work for Conservation and Education

Funds raised at the Expo have helped support two of the Snake River Cutthroats (SRC) top priorities; conservation and education, as well as providing funds needed to operate the chapter. Early Expos in the 90s were modest affairs in comparison to today's event and they did little more than break even financially. But the early Expos provided a learning opportunity for the volunteers who run the Expo, helping them to gain experience and to determine what works and what does not.

Over the past twenty two year, the Expo has helped the Snake River Cutthroats raise and disperse over \$448,265. Conservation projects have received the bulk of these funds, \$424,910, while education programs have received \$23,354. Conservation activities during the 2023 season included several tree planting efforts on Rainey Creek and Third Creek, (a tributary to Rainey). These planting are intended to stabilize stream banks, provide shade to reduce warming of the stream and to improve riparian functionality. Additionally, SRC was instrumental in the replacement of a ditch screen on Rainey Creek. The original screen had become ineffective and was not preventing fish from entering the ditch. This was a two year effort that included an Embrace a stream grant from national Trout Unlimited (TU) and additional contributions from the South Fork Initiative. Volunteers also performed weekly visits to six sites, screens and belts, to clean and maintain these structures. Roadside cleanup is also an ongoing effort with volunteers visiting Route 26 near Falls Creek Boat ramp twice a year.

The biggest share of conservation dollars, \$345,052, have supported TU's Home River Initiatives on the South Fork and Blackfoot Rivers, including projects on their tributaries. These projects have helped protect and restore critical cutthroat trout habitat. While significant on their own, Expo dollars often serve as critical matching funds that are often required by other funding entities. This match allows the Expo dollars to double or even triple their overall financial impact. The Snake River Cutthroats have also provided funds to other conservation organizations with similar interests, including the Henry's Fork Foundation (HFF), Teton Regional Land Trust, Friends of the Teton River, Southeast Idaho TU, and the Idaho Master Naturalists. Some of these donations were large, such as the \$10,000 given to HFF in 2004 to help acquire the Stone Bridge Access on the Henry's Fork. Others were modest, such as the \$1,038 given to the Idaho Master Naturalists in 2015 to buy materials to build and place monofilament recycling bins at popular fishing access points in eastern Idaho. The Idaho Department of Fish and Game has also received funding to help with stream access and fish screens. Expo dollars have also been used to purchase food for our volunteers working on conservation projects, including many of the projects on the Salmon-Challis National Forest over the past 30 years, and have reimbursed volunteers for mileage on their multiple 100-mile roundtrips to Rainey Creek to clean and maintain fish screens. None of these efforts would be possible without Expo dollars to support them and would not be possible without your support.
